HELPFUL HINTS

Figure out your square footage (length x width) to determine the number of yards needed.

For a 3 inch depth, divide total square footage by 108

For a 4 inch depth, divide total square footage by 81

For a 6 inch depth, divide total square footage by 54

For a 1 foot depth, divide total square footage by 27

COMPANY POLICY:

We do not load into Canopied Trucks, Vans, etc.

We do not load less than 1 yard. If the customer would like to pick up less than 1 yard the following alternatives are available:

- 1) Buy our pre-bagged products
- 2) Back vehicle up to pile and shovel in what they need, then pay accordingly at the register
- 3) Bring their own containers and fill them up
- 4) Pay for 1 yard and tell the loader operator just to put in what they need
